We continue to review by-laws and deed restrictions and recommend changes. As always, any changes to by-laws or deed restrictions will need to be voted on.

Pool Safety

The membership has been excellent at keeping the pool area clean so that everyone can enjoy a clean and safe pool area. As usual, I want to list some safety guidelines.

- Please make sure children are supervised at all times. Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult (18 or older) who will be responsible for their conduct.
- A good swim after a hard days work can be very refreshing, but please make use of the shower first. Dirt, sweat and oil from your body can mess up the pool chemistry and cause a pool shutdown. Remember the green pool last year, let's try to not have that again.
- At this time, the pool hours are from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. The pool may be closed at anytime for maintenance and/or cleaning.
- Use of the pool is at the individual's risk. **There are NO lifeguards.**
- No running, diving or horseplay is permitted in the pool area.
- The maximum number of guests a member may bring is **SIX** and the member must be in attendance at all times.
- No animals are allowed in the pool enclosure at any time.
- Glass containers of any kind are **prohibited** within the pool area.
- No alcoholic beverages or tobacco products are permitted within the pool enclosure.
- No cooking is allowed within the pool enclosure. Food and drink may be consumed on the pool patio area or outside the fenced pool enclosure.
- Life preservers, hooks, etc., are for emergency use only. After using lounges and other pool equipment, please return it to its proper position. Do not throw any of the furnishings or equipment into the pool.
- Climbing, hanging from or standing on the fence, patio cover, tables or bathhouse roof are not permitted.
- Proper swim wear will be required of all members, associate members, and guests. Street clothes or cutoffs are not proper swim wear. All babies and small children must be in proper swimming attire (swimmer diapers or babies swimwear). Disposable diapers or cloth diapers are not proper swim wear. **Bacteria from diapers may cause health risks and the dyes contained in non-swimwear may interfere with the chemicals used to aid in keeping the pool clean and sanitary.**

And remember there are cameras in the park and pool area and they do work.
